A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE LORD SELKIRK SCHOOL DIVISION NO. 11

The Lord Selkirk School Division No. 11 came into being on the first day of April, 1959 by an order of the Minister of Education. The School Division became responsible for all secondary education, Grades 9 - 12, and included the following school districts, each of which were included in these wards:

In September of 1959, the Lord Selkirk School Division operated the Selkirk Collegiate Institute with classes in Grades 9 - 12. Also Grade 9 and some Grade 10 classes were held at Happy Thought, Victoria Beach, Lockport, Highland, St. Andrews, Mapleton, and Clandeboye. Grand Marais had Grade 9 - 11 classes for several years.

On February 15, 1967 by an Order of Council, the Lord Selkirk School Division was given jurisdiction over all education for Grades 1 - 12 and the local School Districts were dissolved.

In 1970 the Brokenhead Ojibway Nation requested that their area be included in the Lord Selkirk School Division. This came into effect on January 1, 1971 and that area became Ward 6 of the Lord Selkirk School Division.

This is a very brief synopsis of the Division history. The forty local districts that were consolidated to form the Lord Selkirk Division have a very rich history. The local schools in 1992 are being challenged to research and preserve this. Hopefully we will be able to compile this work. The local histories that were written for the Centennials of the R.M. of St. Andrews, the R.M. of St. Clements, and the Town of Selkirk do have much of the early educational histories.

The Lord Selkirk School Division is proud to be part of the very early developments of educational facilities in the Province of Manitoba. The St. Andrews School traces its history back to the first Anglican missionaries of the 1820's in the Red River Settlement. The St. Andrews School site may have been the site of one of the first schools in the province. As we look at the District numbers, please note the early numbers for:

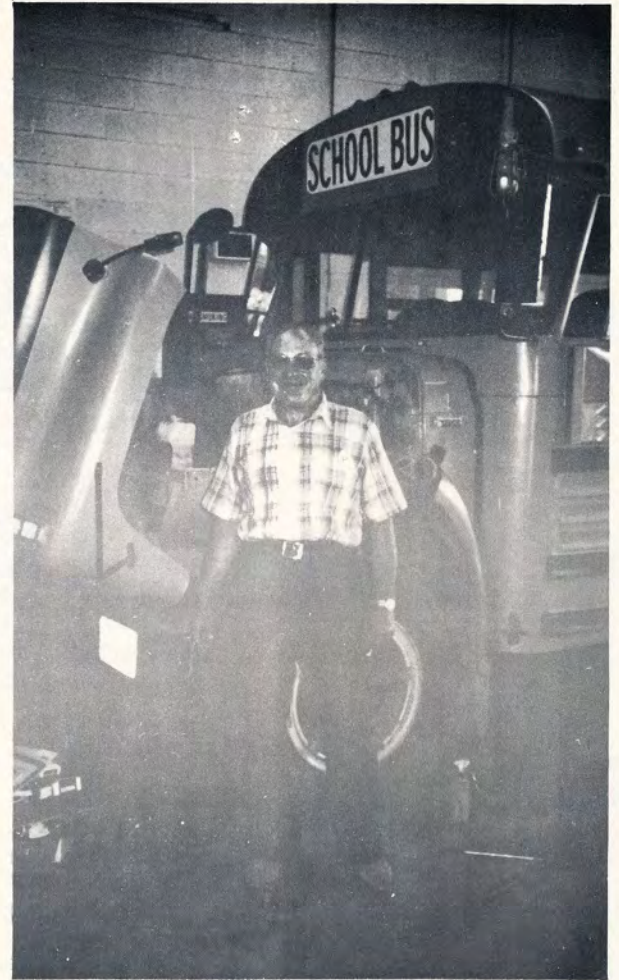
