

The Old Lockport School




- Lockport School was originally an elementary.
- After being open for 60 years, the building was left vacant.
- There were only four teachers and one janitor.
- After the school closed, students were distributed to Mapleton and St. Andrews.
- Recently the building was adapted as a personal home.

The New Lockport School

- A new junior high was built on a new lot.
- This new school was split into three houses called Fort Gary, Red River, and Lord Selkirk.
- 460 kids currently attend the Lockport Junior High which is for kids grade seven to nine.
