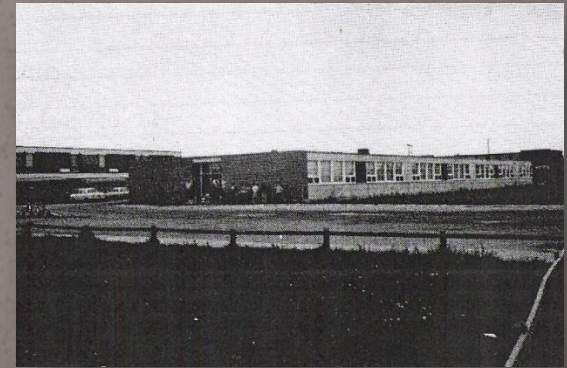
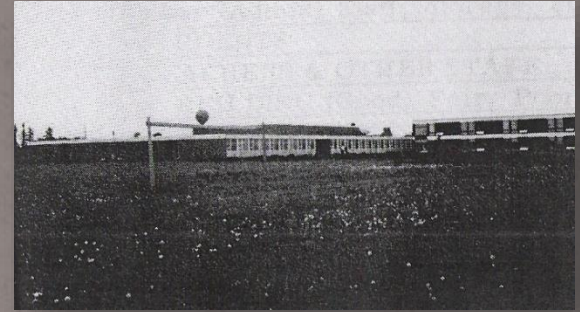

The Beginning

- Selkirk Junior High was constructed in 1956.
- At the time, the building and land cost \$263 200.00.
- The school is 85 114 square feet and was designed by Pratt and Lindgren.
- This building was originally known as the Selkirk Collegiate Institute and was for grades 9 – 12.



The School

- Located at Sophia and Stanley Avenue.
- As of 1968 the school included:
 - Auditorium
 - Gymnasium
 - 4 Science Labs
 - 38 Classrooms
- By 1968 there were 1 101 students attending.
- Additions were made to the school in 1963, 1973, and most recently in 2003.



History

- In 1971, when the new Lord Selkirk Regional Comprehensive Secondary School opened, the Selkirk Collegiate Institute became Selkirk Junior High.
- The school then held grades 7-9.
- In 1987 a French Emersion program began in this division, and Ecole Bonaventure was located in a section of the Selkirk Junior High building.
- In 1992 the first French Immersion students entered Selkirk Junior High.
- The name Selkirk Junior High then evolved into Ecole Selkirk Junior High.
