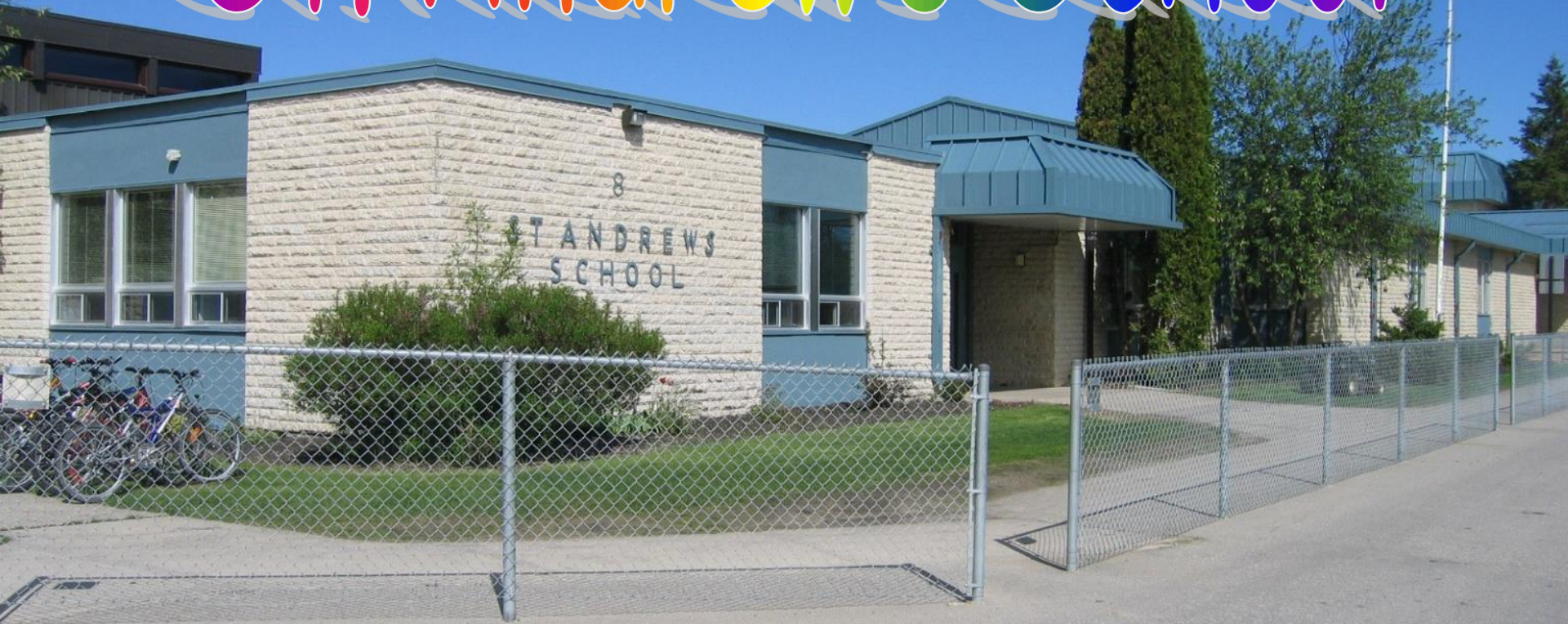

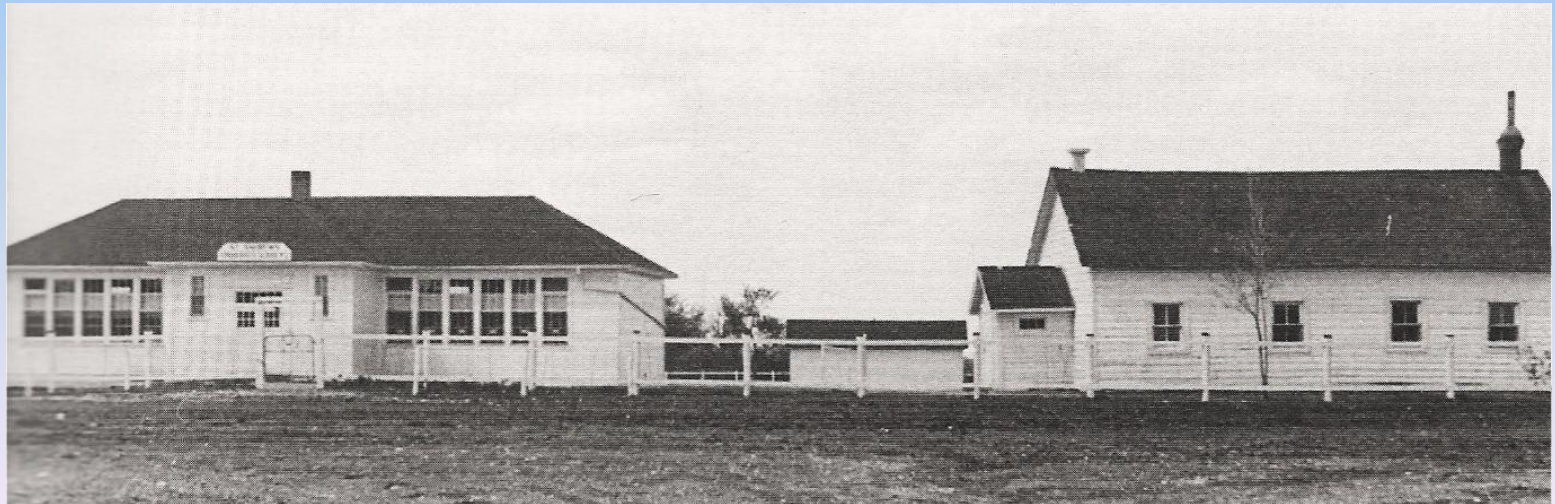

History of Old St. Andrew's School

- ★ **Oldest school in Western Canada**
- ★ **William Cockran was the founder of St. Andrew's School**
- ★ **Originally he and his wife taught school out of their home**

- ★ Old St. Andrew's School founded in 1827
- ★ Was located at 8 St. Andrew's Road
- ★ A total of 5 buildings were used for this school



New St. Andrew's School

- **New St. Andrew's School constructed December of 1965**
- **The cost of the new school was \$4,416,000**
- **In the 1970's St. Andrew's School reached 520 students from grades K to 9**
- **St. Andrew's strives to give students a great school experience**

Cost: \$4,146,000

2001 - St. Andrew's Sewage Plant

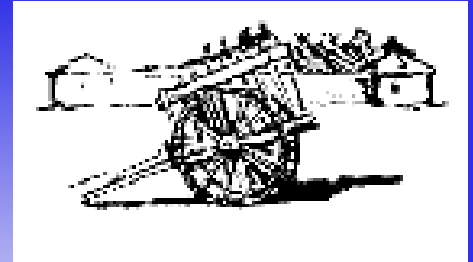
2003 - St. Andrew's Portable
