Before School Division No. 11

- The area between Broken Head Indian Reserve and Victoria Beach consisted of eight schools.
- These eight schools were Stony Point, Beaconia, Balsam Bay, Grand Marais, Dunlop, Hillside, Belair and Victoria Beach.
- After many meetings it was decided that a four-room school would be built near the corner of Highways 12 and 59.

The Beginning of Walter Whyte

- The eight schools of the surrounding area combined into the new building.
- The school, named Walter Whyte Collegiate, was opened in 1960 and had two school buses for transportation.
- It originally held grades 9 – 11.
- In 1969 a 15 161 square foot, nine-room addition was added on to the school.

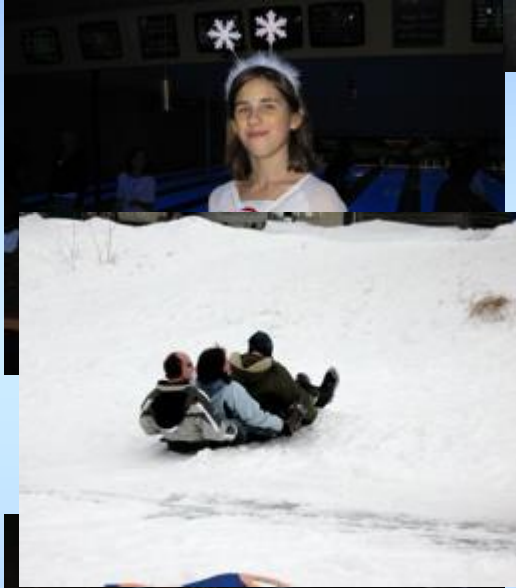
Facts about the school now!

- The current Walter Whyte School is very similar to the school in 1969.
- Technology has improved, but no additions have been made.
- A full time kindergarten program was created.
- There are nine classrooms, a science lab, computer lab and a library.
- There are usually about 120-125 students enrolled each year.
